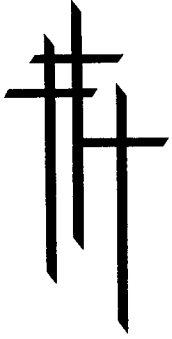

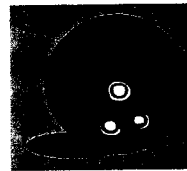

Veterans Meeting September 27 at 6:30pm

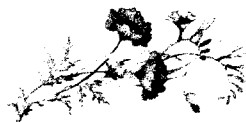
Veterans Column
